Chase takes very seriously our responsibility to handle customer information with confidentiality and discretion at all times. We've been trying to reach you by telephone and may have already spoken with you. As a follow-up, we are writing to let you know that you may be affected by a ruling in a civil lawsuit in Milwaukee County Circuit Court.

The court has ordered us to provide your name and address in a case against Chase involving bank account fees. The details of the case are as follows:
