Re: Appeal of Decision Denying Addition of a Weblink to Shorewood
Village.com

Dear Mr. Davidian:

I am in receipt of two (2) communications from you dated June 2, 2005. The first was addressed to Beth Carey, the Shorewood Library Director, Jeff Hanewall, President of the Shorewood Library Board, and to each of the other members of the Shorewood Library Board c/o of myself. The letter set forth a request for each of the addressees to provide answers to twenty-nine (29) questions, some of which contain subparts. The second communication informed me that you believe your written submission to the Shorewood Library Board will consist of 4,206 files. You do not indicate how many pages are contained in the files. Your communication inquires whether the Library Board should pay \$0.05 per page for your filing and whether you should produce one set for the Board or a separate set for each Board member.

This letter responds to both pieces of correspondence from you. With respect to the letter containing 29 requests for answers, your prior experience with litigation in the federal courts has undoubtedly familiarized you with the formalized practice of requesting answers to written questions, which are called "interrogatories" under the Rules of Civil Procedure, and to request the production of documents for inspection and copying from opposite parties. You also have seen the rules which have been adopted by the Board for the appeal process, which do not contain provisions for obtaining "discovery" from the other side. Furthermore, the Shorewood Library Board does not have the authority to enforce document production through the issuance of a subpoena. Neither Ms. Carey nor the member of the Library Board are required to respond to your 29 enumerated questions. However, your questions will be disseminated to members of



the Board for their consideration in reviewing the presentations submitted in writing by both sides and the verbal presentations made at the hearing. There will no be pre-hearing discovery by either side.

With respect to the materials which you plan to file with the Library Board in connection with your appeal, one copy will be sufficient. Each party bears its own costs of filing materials with the Board for its consideration in this appeal. Thus the Board would expect that you will pay the cost of the single set of documents which you desire to file as part of your appeal.

If you have any further questions regarding these subjects, please communicate them to me.
