
I have received each of the two enclosed public records requests which were directed to my firm by e-mail. (Copies attached). To the best of our ability, our staff has undertaken a review of e-mail and correspondence directories to locate documents responsive to your requests. Documents potentially responsive have been located, printed and/or copied. Responsive documents include some personal correspondence. While I do not believe personal correspondence is required to be produced under the public records law, it has been included within the prepared response.

All documents located responsive to the request will be available for your review at the Shorewood Village Hall. Please feel free to contact Village Manager Edward Madere to set up a convenient date and time for your review of these documents.

All documents responsive to your request have been produced except for a December 18, 2003 Memorandum from my office to the Shorewood Village Board. This Memorandum has as its subject current litigation of Davidian v. Village of Shorewood (Case No. 03-CV-11036) and its production would be an exception from the obligations under the public records law as communication with legal counsel for a matter that is currently in litigation and as protected under the attorney/client privilege.

To the extent that you believe this response to our request is a denial, you should be aware that the decision is subject to review by a law suit for mandamus or review by the Attorney General or District Attorney under Wisconsin Statutes § 19.35(4).

RE: Village Board Meeting of February 3, 2003

Minutes and Accounts

Trustees Eckman and Langenkamp were unable to attend the meeting. The minutes of January 20, 2003 and Accounts of January 29, 2003 were approved as presented.

Citizens to be Heard

Jim Larson indicated that **Congressman Sensenbrenner** had conducted a town hall meeting recently which was attended by very few people, most of whom were not from Shorewood. He indicated that he was very disappointed that no one from the Village Board attended the meeting.

Andrew Nerbun indicated that at the previous meeting Kathleen Fletcher had noted that there were a number of **duplexes in the Village for rent**. Mr. Nerbun contacted the duplex owners who indicated that property taxes were high and it was difficult to raise rent because of low mortgages for home ownership and low apartment rents. Many are foregoing making improvements to their properties. Mr. Nerbun indicated that this may be useful information in making future decisions.

Joseph Mangiamele noted that rising **property taxes are affecting the over 65-age group**. He is concerned about their status and how it is affected by the general revenue situation of the federal, state and local governments. He urged that Village board members study this situation and that they should begin to do something sooner rather than later. The Board should look at a long term decrease in taxes rather than a long term increase.

Presentations

Tom Chapman, **MMSD** representative, made a presentation on the district's new program on storm water best management practices. Mr. Chapman has been working with DPW staff on the MMSD funded program to mitigate basement backup problems in the Village's combined sewer area. Mr. Chapman reviewed various methods to either reduce or slow down rainwater getting into sewer systems.

New Business

Related to the above item, the Village Board was asked to consider a staff request to authorize **bidding of a sewer-lining project**. Mustafa Emir, the Village's consulting engineer, made a presentation showing that in Basin 1, located in a separated sewer area, was experiencing basement backups because of the heavy infiltration of storm water during rain events from the storm sewer into the sanitary sewer through defective sanitary sewer laterals. After discussion, the **Board authorized the staff to bid a project that will involve approximately \$150,000 worth of sewer lining work**. The majority of this will be lining storm sewers in Basin 1 (\$125,000). The balance of the work will be done on a small portion of Murray and on Stowell north of Lake Bluff Boulevard.

Please let Jim Bartnicki or Jim Swenson know if you are interested in any of the materials used in either Richard Chapman's presentation or Mr. Emir's presentation. Also, Jim and Jim, it would be appreciated if you would begin preparing information to distribute to Basin 1 residents about the storm sewer lining project, the storm sewer laterals, and what the Village anticipates achieving with the project.

Continuing with the topic of sewers, the Village Board discussed potential **modifications to the Village Code regarding storm sewer laterals**. The code currently requires that homes be connected directly to either a storm sewer or a combined sewer. It is likely that modifications will have to be made in this policy because of the need to reduce the storm water flow into some sewers, especially the combined area, during heavy rains. Much of the storm water comes directly from downspouts. Removing the direct connection of down spouts to the combined system and allowing the water to either flow across lawns or into rain barrels would reduce peak flow. The Board, however, wants to be very cautious in modifying the policy due to small lots in Shorewood and the possibility of having down spouts disconnected from the combined system or storm sewer to have the water damage adjacent property. **The Streets and Building Committee will continue to review this matter.**

Village Board approved bids for the **construction of a new water main** on Murray Avenue between Capitol and East Shorewood. This work will be done immediately prior to the reconstruction of Murray Avenue this spring. Staff was pleased with the low bid which was about \$35,000 under estimate. Total bid was around \$60,000.

The Board approved an agreement between Milwaukee County and the Village regarding the Village's use of the **county's 800 MHz radio system**. It is the present intent of the North Shore municipal police departments (and potentially, NSFD0 to use the 800 MHz system beginning in January 2004. The County operates this system and an agreement between the County and each municipality for the use of the system is required. It is the present intent of the north shore municipalities to keep public works on its current system (simplex).

Minutes and Accounts

Trustees Eckman and Langenkamp were unable to attend the meeting. The minutes of January 20, 2003 and Accounts of January 29, 2003 were approved as presented.

Citizens to be Heard

Jim Larson indicated that **Congressman Sensenbrenner** had conducted a town hall meeting recently which was attended by very few people, most of whom were not from Shorewood. He indicated that he was very disappointed that no one from the Village Board attended the meeting.

Andrew Nerbun indicated that at the previous meeting Kathleen Fletcher had noted that there were a number of **duplexes in the Village for rent**. Mr. Nerbun contacted the duplex owners who indicated that property taxes were high and it was difficult to raise rent because of low mortgages for home ownership and low apartment rents. Many are foregoing making improvements to their properties. Mr. Nerbun indicated that this may be useful information in making future decisions.

Joseph Mangiamele noted that rising **property taxes are affecting the over 65-age group**. He is concerned about their status and how it is affected by the general revenue situation of the federal, state and local governments. He urged that Village board members study this situation and that they should begin to do something sooner rather than later. The Board should look at a long term decrease in taxes rather than a long term increase.

Presentations

Tom Chapman, **MMSD** representative, made a presentation on the district's new program on storm water best management practices. Mr. Chapman has been working with DPW staff on the MMSD funded program to mitigate basement backup problems in the Village's combined sewer area. → League Lobbying Event Scheduled For February 20

All municipal officials are invited to join the League's Lobbying Corps in Madison on Wednesday, February 20th to oppose the Governor's plan to eliminate the shared revenue program. The League's Lobbying Corps consists of 33 district coordinators, one from each state Senate district. Its purpose is to lobby state legislators to gain support for the League's legislative agenda as approved by the Board of Directors. The League's Lobbying Corps will be convening in Madison on February 20th to meet with legislators regarding the Governor's budget repair bill and other items important to municipalities.

On February 20, the Lobbying Corps will initially gather at 10:00 a.m. at the Concourse Hotel for a briefing by League staff. At approximately 10:40, local officials will walk to the Capitol and begin meeting with their legislators.

→ Budget Repair Bill Introduced in the Assembly

This week, the Governor's budget repair plan was introduced as Assembly Bill 1 of the January 2002 Special Session. The bill was introduced by the Assembly Committee on Organization and referred to the Joint Finance Committee. ➔ **McCallum Kills Campaign Finance Reform**

Last week the Senate considered and gave preliminary approval to Senate Bill 104, the comprehensive campaign finance reform measure introduced by Sen. Mike Ellis (R-Neenah) and supported by the League. This week, because Governor McCallum refused to pledge that he would not partially veto the bill, the Senate declined to take a final vote on SB 104. Senate Majority Leader Chvala has said that the

Senate needs written assurance from the Governor that he will not use his partial veto powers to upset the bipartisan compromise contained in SB 104.

Recently Introduced Legislation

Recently introduced bills and joint resolutions relevant to local government are summarized below. The committee that the bill or joint resolution has been referred to is designated in parentheses. An asterisk (*) indicates the bill is scheduled for a public hearing. More information on hearings is provided below under "Public Hearing Schedule for Upcoming Week."

AB 766 Immunity For Use Of Solid Waste in Public Projects

By Rep. Kedzie, Sen. Schultz By Request of DNR. Under current law, the department of natural resources (DNR) may characterize a solid waste as a special waste available for beneficial use in a public works project and must maintain a list of those characterized solid wastes in a format that is available to the public. Under this bill, solid wastes that DNR has exempted from the normal disposal requirement are considered special wastes and may be characterized by DNR as suitable for beneficial use in public works projects. This bill requires DNR to maintain a list of those special wastes that are suitable for use in specified types of public works projects. The list may include conditions under which the wastes may be used in public works projects. Under the bill, the current provisions granting immunity from liability apply to the use of those listed special wastes in public works projects if the conditions established by DNR for their use are met. In addition, the current law provisions prohibiting immunity for acts of reckless, wanton, or intentional misconduct or that result in the death or injury of an individual apply. (Committee On Environment)



AB 768 Adoption of Internal Revenue Code Changes

By Rep. Krawczyk, Sen. Burke. This bill adopts, for income tax purposes, the changes to the federal Internal Revenue Code made by the individual income and pension and individual retirement arrangement provisions of the federal Economic Growth and Tax Relief Reconciliation Act of 2001, excluding the section related to a deduction for higher education expenses which is similar to a deduction allowed under current state law. (Joint Committee On Finance. Referred To Joint Committee On Tax Exemptions)

SB 411 Authorizing the City Of Bayfield to Become a Premier Resort Area

By Sen. Jauch, Rep. Sherman. This bill allows the city of Bayfield to become a premier resort area notwithstanding the fact that it does not meet the generally applicable requirement that at least 40% of the equalized assessed value of the taxable property within a political subdivision be used by tourism-related retailers. A premier resort area may impose a tax at a rate of 0.5% of the gross receipts from the sale, lease, or rental of goods or services that are subject to the general sales and use tax and are sold by tourism-related retailers. The proceeds of the tax may only be used to pay for "infrastructure expenses" within the jurisdiction of the premier resort area. The definition of "infrastructure expenses" includes the costs of purchasing, constructing, or improving parking lots; transportation facilities, including roads and bridges; sewer and water facilities; recreational facilities; fire fighting equipment; and police vehicles. (Committee On Insurance, Tourism, And Transportation)

SB 412 Revisions and Additions to Condominium Law.

By Joint Legislative Council. This bill revises and makes comprehensive changes to the laws governing the creation and operation of condominiums. The bill makes the following changes to laws governing municipal regulation of condominiums:

1. Clarifies, with editorial changes, the prohibition on imposing requirements under zoning or other land use ordinances or regulations that discriminate against the condominium form of ownership.
2. Clarifies the prohibition on applying a provision of a state or local building code differently to a building in a condominium than it would be applied if the building were under a different form of ownership, unless the different application is expressly permitted by the building code. Further clarifies that if the different application is expressly permitted, it must be reasonably related to the nature of condominium ownership. Similarly, clarifies that no subdivision ordinance may apply to a condominium unless, as currently required, the ordinance is expressly applicable to condominiums and, as added by the bill, its application is reasonably related to the nature of condominium ownership.
3. Clarifies the prohibition against enactment of any law, ordinance or regulation that would impose a burden or restriction on a condominium that is not imposed on all other property of similar character not subjected to a condominium declaration to specify that the law, ordinance or regulation may not impose a "greater" burden or restriction and, additionally, may not provide a lower level of service to a condominium than would be imposed or provided if the condominium were under a different form of ownership.

A Statement from MMSD Commission Chairman Dennis Grzezinski Regarding Distorted "Research" from WPRI

The Wisconsin Policy Research Institute (WPRI) should be ashamed of its latest report "Government Pollution-The Metropolitan Milwaukee Sewerage District's (*sic*) Impact on Lake Michigan." It is an embarrassing diatribe. The "research" it claims to have conducted amounts to reading some old newspaper stories, sprinkling in some half-truths along with outright falsehoods, then jumping to wholly unsupported conclusions.

Any legitimate analysis of the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD) performance would cite experts with real knowledge of water quality issues or wastewater treatment. Not a single such credible source is named in the WPRI document. The author made no effort to contact MMSD for information or perspective.

In fact, since MMSD completed the Deep Tunnel and the Water Pollution Abatement Program, the water in Milwaukee area rivers and Lake Michigan is measurably cleaner. That is directly attributable to the Deep Tunnel and the Water Pollution Abatement Program reductions in sewer overflows. Before the Deep Tunnel went online, rain-induced sewer overflows exceeded fifty per year. Now, there is an average of about two and a half such overflows annually, and there have been no weather-related overflows for more than a year. This is an improvement unmatched by any large metropolitan community in the nation.

WPRI board member and Metropolitan Milwaukee Association of Commerce (MMAC) President Timothy Sheehy wrote to the MMSD commissioners this week saying:

“...The MMAC has been following the MMSD performance and feels that the district is being run efficiently. Costs of the Milwaukee operation, when compared to other areas of the country are very favorable.

“...Headlines can sometimes ignore that the MMSD is running a cost effective system and one that is very favorable to its national competition in both cost and performance.”

A prominent member of the Wisconsin State Senate, Alberta Darling (R-River Hills) wrote to the MMSD executive director on Thursday praising the district's fiscal constraint and quality services:

“...I want to commend you, your staff and the Commissioners of the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District for your efforts to deliver a budget that does not increase property taxes. You have demonstrated that by careful planning, government can operate like a business and deliver quality services without increasing prices.”

In its latest report, the WPRI agenda is clear: they want the customers of MMSD to surrender their oversight of wastewater treatment to suburban and rural interests. WPRI is attempting to restart the sewer wars of the 1980's with distortion and misrepresentation. Its report is a seriously flawed attempt to sway public policy.

BLUE SKY MEETING - APRIL 29, 2002 - NOTES

All members of the Village Board, Ray Pollen, Leeann Butschlick, and Edward Madere attended the meeting.

President Dow followed the printed agenda. Following are items from the discussion.

- \$ It was requested that an organizational chart of the Village be provided.
- \$ It was asked that a list of various Village boards, commissions and committees along with their responsibilities, status, etc. be provided to the Board.
- \$ A letter to be sent to Shorewood Responds asking that meetings be held at a time when all members may participate.
- \$ Schedule a meeting for the Village President to meet with the chairpersons of all the boards, commissions and committees.
- \$ School operating expenses and potential impact on property taxes was discussed. It was asked that information be sought from the school concerning this.
- \$ The annual Village/School joint meeting should be scheduled.
- \$ There was a discussion on long-range planning. It was indicated that the costs would be in the \$25,000 - \$40,000 range. Staff was asked to develop Requests for Proposals.
- \$ It was noted that the schools, zoning code, land use etc. should be included as part of the long-range planning process. This item was assigned to the Development and Long Range Planning Committee.
- \$ Quality of life issues:
 - S Concern was expressed about noise caused by leaf blowers, weed whackers, etc.
 - S Need to encourage landscaping/beautification - similar to Image Enhancement Committee award - perhaps involve Garden Room
 - S There was a perception that crime in certain parts of the community B need to improve public relations - consider revitalizing Block Watch Program.

- \$ Under shared services: Should meet with Whitefish Bay officials and perhaps with all North Shore municipal officials about shared services, working together, etc.
- \$ Elderly services were praised. It was noted that the elderly can also provide services as

professionals.

§ Under community recreation

S It was noted that the old school pool is in bad shape. Jack Linehan should be contacted regarding its status.

S The beach equipment was questioned and it was felt that the old children=s play equipment should be movedBperhaps new equipment could be purchased through fund-raising, Shorewood Foundation, Business Improvement District, etc.

§ Under Business District -

S There was some discussion regarding staff.

S Concern was raised about the intersection of Jarvis and Oakland that there should be a lined crosswalk at that intersection. There is also concern about the driveway at Sendik=s and indicated that John Nehring was amenable to closing the driveway. This tied in to the concerns raised about the need to reverse the entrance and exits of Sendik=s parking lot.

§ Discussion on e-mail indicated that those messages are subject to open records law. Mr. Pollen is going to provide information on this.

§ The issue of residency was raised regarding management staff and whether the Village Board should adopt a policy requiring that new hires for management be required to live in the Village. A best practices comparison, that is what other communities are doing, was raised.

Sales, prices of homes increase

But some hot spots in metro area cool off

Powered by houses selling for less than \$200,000, sales of metro Milwaukee existing homes rose 6.8% in the first half of 2002, compared with the first half of last year.

Average prices climbed between 6% and 15% higher in many communities, according to the July market analysis from Metro Multiple Listing Service.

Still, some former hot spots cooled: Shorewood's prices dropped about \$35,000 and Farmington's, about \$17,000. Dips were reported in Richfield, Mukwonago and Belgium, down about \$9,000, \$8,000 and \$6,000, respectively.

Sales of existing homes through June 30 showed the best market performance in three years for Milwaukee, Waukesha, Ozaukee and Washington Counties - 8,512, compared with 7,967 in the first half of 2001 and 7,509 in the first half of 2000, data from the Wauwatosa-based realty tracking firm shows.

"First-time homeowners, especially in Milwaukee, and especially with interest rates at 6.5% (for a 30-year mortgage) have been the determining factor," said Donald J. Horning, president of Brookfield-based Shorewest Realtors, one of Wisconsin's largest volume home sellers.

Average prices climbed in nearly every municipality, led by gains in rural areas such as Genesee, which was up more than \$80,000, and Nashotah, which was up about \$63,000. Hikes of \$20,000 or more were recorded in Bayside, Brookfield, Cedarburg, Delafield, Elm Grove, Mequon, River Hills, Saukville, Wales and Whitefish Bay.

Volatility in the stock market and historically low money market rates could explain why more cash is flowing into real estate.

"People look at the stock market losses, look at the appreciation rates they can have, and they buy a home," Horning said. "We hit the spectrum of the market - from \$1.5 million to \$50,000, and our average unit price is up 8.1% this year. To increase that much is beyond our expectations."

The market's pinnacle was tiny River Hills, where average home price rose to \$657,747 from \$620,250 last year. A distant second - Delafield in Waukesha County's lake country - averaged \$366,118, up from \$331,683 last year.

At the market's bottom, the City of Milwaukee became the area's last municipality to cross the \$100,000 border, climbing to a \$101,341 average sales price this year from \$94,287 a year ago.

"You wonder what could we have in place, if anything, for those who can't afford a \$125,000 house?" commented Michael D. Holloway, president of buyer-agent-only Homebuyers Associates in Shorewood.

Credit metro Milwaukee's prosperous housing market to the dyspeptic economy, whose slogging pace has kept mortgage interest rates near 30-year lows and whose financial market losses have turned disillusioned investors to the simple value of homes, said Metro MLS President Gary Gerhardt, a broker and owner of Re/Max Realty 100 in Brookfield.

"It's surprising that our run has continued. Typically, real estate markets run in cycles, but the numbers just keep getting better and better." Gerhardt said.

"It's an incredible scenario."

There's a distinct caution among shoppers - sales times are running a few days to a few weeks longer than last year, and prices have softened in the over-\$300,000 market and in far-flung areas, Gerhardt said.

"But there's evidence that the market is very, very strong, and fast, up to \$200,000. Look at Milwaukee County - average 68 days on market, average price \$129,565. Look at the least sales time - West Allis, a good, solid place where average price is \$118,000," he said.

In Ozaukee County, site of the state's highest average sales prices and some of the area's longest work-home commutes, average sales times are 50% longer, Gerhardt noted.

"Price and proximity to Milwaukee seem to have a definite effect on the market," he said.

Robin Fazio, co-owner of Buyers Vantage, a discount realty brokerage in Brookfield and Madison, put it this way:

"The higher the price range, the more days on market. For \$150,000 - that's the first-time home buyer market in Waukesha - buyers are pretty plentiful. In the \$189,000-to-\$219,000 range, houses seem to go really quickly. Above that, people start questioning whether this is what they want to do, waiting to see what the economy does."

The typical Buyers Vantage listing sold for \$210,000 last year and \$240,000 this year, Fazio said. "But our days on market are longer - 43 this year, and it was 30 last year. And we're seeing signs that the buyer pool is not as plentiful."

Also not as plentiful are buyers ready to pay what some overconfident Shorewood sellers are asking.

Shorewood's market is paying the price for what Holloway called "the panic mentality" gripping the North Shore suburb last year as strong demand heated to fever-pitch. Average prices shot up nearly \$60,000 amid multiple bids and even an occasional auction in a small - 79 sales in all 2001 - market."

Shorewood's price bubble popped, and for a simple reason - "people just couldn't afford it anymore," Holloway said. "Maybe you can buy at \$200,000, but you can't at \$225,000."

Panic mentality is a rarity in metro Milwaukee's steady-if-not-staid market, but Holloway said even he fell victim to it.

"I sold my house this year and it sold within 60 days but I hung my hat on what the stock market calls irrational exuberance. I know my house was worth \$235,000 to \$240,000. I'm a professional at pricing, after all, but when a house three doors over, probably not as nice, sold in the \$250,000 area, I priced mine at \$256,000.

"In 10 days, I realized my mistake. Tons of people looked at it, but it wasn't going to sell. So I priced it at \$249,000 and it sold for \$240,000."

Dear Rod and Ed:

I will be travelling on business on Monday in Dallas and will be unable to attend the board meeting.

Two issues I would like to comment on that are agenda items for Monday's meeting. Can you please make my comments known when these agenda items are in discussion during the regular board meeting and the committee meeting for Streets and Buildings.

1. The financing plan proposed at our last meeting with Keith Kolb. Based on the information that was shared by staff and Mr. Kolb at our last meeting, I feel strongly that we, as a board need a "compelling" reason to proceed forward with the proposed restructuring of our debt. If any of the following criteria were evident: 1. A "significant cost savings"; 2. A reduction in the term of the loan (s). Possibly I missed something in Mr. Kolb's presentation, but with the facts as they were presented, I heard both staff and Mr. Kolb state that the primary reason for proposing this restructuring was the benefit of "evening" out the bumps in debt service for 3-4 years based on the library project's increase in our overall debt load.

What I want to be perfectly clear about from my perspective is that we do not go down a road that will (by this proposed restructuring) "hide" this debt in such a way that we no longer "see" the long term capital expenditures that Shorewood makes. This can have the effect of minimizing our taxpayer's knowledge and understanding as to why their taxes are at a given level or what "cause/effect" relationship our tax rate has on capital spending decisions we make. It is critically important, in my opinion, that the average tax payer can understand his tax rate (over a period of time), with simplicity, straight forward answers from the Village, and transparency as to our decisions affecting the long term debt of the Village. As there certainly exist many possibilities for further capital expenditures in future years in Shorewood (Schools, Police Station, etc.); we need to be extremely conscious of the decisions we are currently making to insure they are in the best long term interests of our fellow tax payers. What I would never want to happen is that a decision such as this proposed "restructuring" has the effect of paving the way for future capital spending by giving the appearance (incorrectly) that "our taxes never went up" as a result of the library project" or any other large scale spending projects taken on by the Village.

2. The agenda item for Streets and Buildings. I received phone calls from several residents whose property is immediately adjacent to the proposed street improvement program in the northwest end of the Village. The survey that was sent out includes many properties who are not adjacent to the improvements and thus would not be affected near the level as those with properties next to the improvement in question. My fear is that we are pushing proposed modifications on residents who may not desire them. I would not support the proposed modifications unless the property owners immediately adjacent to the modifications were in full support of the project.

SUBJECT: **FOX POINT'S USE OF THE TRANSFER STATION**

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Over the past year, staff has been working with Whitefish Bay and Fox Point in an effort to have Fox Point use the jointly owned transfer station to dispose of solid waste. It looks as though we're ready to have the Shorewood and Whitefish Bay Village Boards approve an agreement with the Fox Point Village Board regarding the use of the transfer station at your January 19, 2004 meeting.

Before any action is taken, staff would like to explain and answer any questions about the proposed agreement at your January 5, 2004 meeting, so any changes that are needed may be made prior to your January 19th meeting. The terms of the draft agreement are as follows:

- This agreement shall commence when approved by the Village Boards of Fox Point, Whitefish Bay and Shorewood and shall remain in force until terminated by a six month written notice by either Fox Point or Whitefish Bay and Shorewood.
- Fox Point municipal vehicles may use the transfer facility for disposal of their solid waste on normal workdays Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. or as determined by the Shorewood Director of Public Works
- Fox Point will pay a tipping fee equal to the fee per ton paid by Shorewood and Whitefish Bay, (\$32.18/ton in 2003), the State Environmental tax equal to the tax per ton paid by Shorewood and Whitefish Bay (\$3.66/ton in 2003), plus a \$3.50 per ton surcharge. This fee is intended to help defray capital costs related to the transfer station. The tipping fee and environmental tax will be adjusted in January of 2004, and each January thereafter. The surcharge will remain constant, but will be reviewed every three years and may be adjusted at that time.
- Fox Point trucks will be weighed at the Shorewood Public Works yard prior to and after dumping. Weight tickets will be printed in triplicate -- one given to the driver, one mailed with the invoice and one retained for Shorewood DPW records.
- Invoices will be sent monthly.

Deleted:

- Employees are expected to clean any debris or mess left at the station while dumping. In addition, Fox Point will participate in the bi-weekly clean up of the transfer station by providing two employees for two hours each once per quarter to assist with clean up.
- Drivers will change trailers or assist with trailer changes when necessary.

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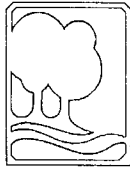
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Any damage done by Fox Point employees will be repaired at Fox Point's cost. Fox Point advised it typically will have one truck per day dumping at the transfer station, with no more than six trucks per week. Fox Point estimates approximately 2,000 tons of solid waste will be hauled to the transfer station each year. This would generate a revenue stream of approximately \$7,000 per year for use by the transfer station to offset future capital costs. For example, the yard waste compactor is scheduled to be replaced by 2007.

Fox Point was offered the option of "buying in to" the entire transfer station and becoming a full partner, but opted to a "pay as you go" method with a per/ton surcharge.

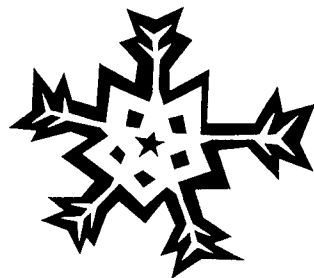



Republicans Freeze State Spending and Property Taxes *Plan fixes Gov. Doyle's tax shifts and property tax increases*

Madison... The Joint Finance Committee will vote today on a Republican plan that freezes state and local spending and more fairly distributes state aid to municipalities, according to the Senate Majority Leader Mary Panzer (R-West Bend).

Republicans announced their Taxpayer Protection Plan today.

"Our budget taxes less, spends less and borrows less than Governor Doyle's," said Senate Co-Chair of the Joint Finance Committee Alberta Darling. "We focused on taxpayers, community safety, children's education and job growth."

The Republican plan will protect property tax payers from Governor Doyle's projected 9.45% property tax increase, freeze state operational spending at current levels and local taxes to the rate of growth for 3 years. The plan also freezes school district levies, but more than doubles Governor Doyle's support for educating children by transferring an additional \$135 million in state spending cuts to local school aids.

"The state must lead the way with strict controls and difficult cuts before we impose a freeze on local governments," said Senate Majority Leader Mary Panzer.

Local governments and school districts are also given more latitude in choosing health care plans and determining contribution rates to help them address increasing health care costs while the levy freeze is in effect. Local governments would be allowed to enter the private health insurance plans offered to state employees or select other private providers to maintain benefits and save taxpayer dollars.

"The greatest concern we hear from local governments and schools is with skyrocketing health insurance rates," said Darling. "Our plan will give local governments the tools to

save tax dollars by joining with the state insurance pool or finding other options to maintain benefits and save money.”

Panzer agreed, “It only makes sense to let all levels of government maintain healthcare benefits for employees while saving taxpayer dollars.”

Republican legislators will guarantee that public safety is maintained by directing Shared Revenue dollars to vital police and fire services. The new formula recognizes the critical importance of emergency services by focusing aid reimbursements to these priorities.

“Local governments face the same tough cuts the state has faced,” said Panzer. “We will guarantee these priorities along with job development are maintained in tough times.”

The Republican plan also amends the shared revenue distribution formula to lessen the impact of Governor Doyle’s cut in state aid to local governments.

“Governor Doyle’s plan to distribute local aids cuts funding to some towns by over 90%,” said Darling. “Our plan is more fair by allowing no more than a 12% cut and providing additional funding to address local concerns about maintaining fire and police protection.”

“I’ve said all along that this will be an honest taxpayers budget,” said Darling. “We’re not going to raise state taxes, we’re going to freeze state and local spending to control local property taxes and create jobs. This is what the hard working families of this state asked for when they elected us and we owe it to them to get the job done right.”

The Joint Finance Committee will meet today to vote on this package and any additional items related to the budget. Once the Committee finishes its action on the budget it goes before the full legislature for a vote in both houses.

“Governor Doyle shifted over a half-billion dollars onto the backs of property taxpayers,” said Panzer. “We have made tough choices to protect all taxpayers, guarantee community safety and promote the jobs that our families rely on.”

The Village purchased and has displayed red, white and blue bunting on streetlights in the business district following the September 11, 2001 tragedy, when there was great unity in this country. We also used it for the 2002 July 4th holiday.

This time deciding what to do is more difficult. There certainly seems to be considerable differences regarding the War in Iraq as noted by the signs around the Village showing opposition to the war. I am not sure whether residents would see the bunting as support for our soldiers or for the war and the administration. I must admit that my thoughts on this are colored by my service as an U.S. Army Infantry officer during a very unpopular war. My inclination is to put up the bunting and leave it up through July 4th.

Please let me know if you have any objections to the Village putting up the red, white, and blue bunting.

Today's Milwaukee *Journal Sentinel* included the following story regarding liability insurance. The link is also included.

Some of the information in the story might be a bit misleading. The League of Wisconsin Municipalities has operated a liability insurance program for a number of years. Until two years ago the plan was provided through Wausau Insurance. For a variety of reasons, the League dropped Wausau and went with Kemper.

The Village of Shorewood had participated in the League program for a number of years, but after consultation with the T.E. Brennan, Village's liability insurance consultant, it was decided to stay with Wausau, rather than continue with the League and Kemper. Quotes from both and were basically the same. The consultant's main concern was that Kemper was offering coverage that seemed unrealistic and not fiscally prudent for an insurance company to offer. We were not surprised that Kemper backed out after just two years, but not because of terrorism which has negatively affected all liability carriers. A number of municipalities had similar concerns and stayed with Wausau.

When the Cities & Villages Mutual Insurance Company was formed in 1987, the Village of Shorewood chose not to participate because of the risk though it was invited to nearly every year. The Village has used this to its advantage in getting competitive rates from Wausau. We are a little reluctant to participate in the League's latest venture just yet, but will consider it in the future should it prove to be successful.

**Insurance co-op created for cities, villages
Move prompted by firm dropping coverage over terror attacks**

The threat of terrorism has persuaded an insurance carrier to drop liability coverage for about 200 cities and villages in Wisconsin, leading to the formation of a new statewide self-insurance cooperative.

As part of a corporate retrenching attributed to terrorist threats, Kemper Insurance Cos. has decided not to renew coverage under a nearly 20-year-old program operated by the League of Wisconsin Municipalities.

The program insures about 200 municipalities against such common government mishaps as pedestrians injured on public sidewalks, police officers or firefighters hurt on the job, and motorists colliding with city vehicles.

With Kemper dropping out at the end of the year, League of Wisconsin Municipalities officials have invested \$5 million to establish a new self-insurance pool of the sort that became popular during an insurance industry crunch in the 1980s.

But some affected cities and villages are shopping around for other options to protect themselves and their taxpayers from liability.

Re: Village Assessor Agreements

This is to seek your Committee's recommendation and Village Board approval for a continuation of the contract for assessment services between the Village and James Wronski and for the revised agreement between the Village and Ad Valorem, Inc (provides assessment office clerical services). As discussed during and approved as part of the 2004 budget process, the 2004 assessor's contract is \$51,660. The contract for Ad Valorem, Inc. is \$25,200. Please recall that the preliminary 2004 assessor budget was reduced by \$2,400 by closing the office to the public on Mondays.

When reviewing the above and comparing it to the 2004 approved budget, I discovered that a typographical error had been made in the preliminary assessor budget. The amount for contracted services for 2004 read "\$79,060". It should have read "\$79,260". This \$200 difference was carried through to the approved budget. Based on the past, it is reasonable to expect that the \$200 will likely be absorbed by other items coming in under budget.

A second approval is requested for the 2003 continuation of the contract between the Village and James Wronski and between the Village and Ad Valorem, Inc. These involve only fee adjustments, the amounts of which (Assessor [\$49,200] and Ad Valorem, Inc. [\$26,400]) were approved by the Village Board in its approval of the 2003 Village budget. In my review of the file, I could not find separate Village Board approval of the contract extension as had been done in previous years. This typically was done during the budget process or immediately thereafter.

Mr. Wronski and Ad Valorem, Inc. have provided quality assessment services to the Village. Additionally, assessment responsibilities and workload remain high in large part due to the continued high sales volume.

In case you missed it, this letter to the editor appeared in today's Journal Sentinel.

SEWAGE**Practice of blending is appropriate**

The Dec. 11 article stating that 40 million gallons of partially treated sewage was dumped into Lake Michigan missed the mark and misstated the facts on the key practice of blending ("MMSD dumps 40 million gallons"). Blending has been an accepted, environmentally beneficial practice for wastewater treatment plants nationwide for decades.

Despite the article's misleading statement that blending has merely been "OK'd by federal environmental officials as a last-ditch measure," a reading of the Environmental Protection Agency's Nov. 7 guidance on this issue would have revealed that, according to the EPA, blending is a critical environmental and public health safeguard.

As the EPA states, blending ensures that peak flows during periods of heavy rain receive basic treatment in full compliance with a treatment plant's Clean Water Act permit requirements. Blending protects a plant's secondary treatment unit from wash-out, which would cause severe environmental and public health consequences. Blending also protects homes and businesses from sewer backups, which would directly threaten public health.

The Association of Metropolitan Sewerage Agencies urges responsible newspapers like the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel and groups like Friends of Milwaukee Rivers to review the reasons behind the need for blending peak flows as well as the dangerous consequences that could ensue without blending.

RE: Winter Parking Regulations

Over time, Village staff has discussed whether winter parking regulations might be changed. Currently, on many streets in the Village, vehicles are not allowed to park on the winter-restricted side of the street during December, January and February. Given the last several moderate winters, some residents have asked why it is necessary to have this regulation and whether it could be modified.

Staff would like to review with your committee a suggested change to winter parking regulations before any proposed ordinances are suggested. Village streets, 30 feet wide and over, typically allow parking on both sides of the street during most of the year. Staff is suggesting that on those streets which normally allow parking on both sides, that winter parking regulations be modified to prohibit parking during the months of December, January, February and March between the hours of **11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m.**

The months selected recognize that it seems just as likely for a snowstorm to occur in March as in December. Public Works has found that snow removal is most effectively handled between 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. when there is considerably less street traffic. This time would also not be inconvenient to most residents. If a heavy snowfall does occur during the day and daytime plowing operations are necessary, a snow emergency will be called and parking will be prohibited, as is currently the case. Additionally, as is also currently the case, residents having parties where guests will stay past 11:00 p.m. can contact the Police Department.

Staff discussed other approaches such as prohibiting the parking after "X" inches of snow, etc. This is always debated -- how deep, when measured, where measured. The above suggestion seemed to make the most sense given the time the streets are plowed.

The purpose of this memo is to preface a brief presentation Jim Lynch will make to your committee on Tuesday, October 7.

Recently, staff met with Leonard Sobczak, of Eastmore Real Estate, owner of a number of apartment buildings in Shorewood. The purpose of this meeting was to discuss providing additional parking on North Oakland Avenue for businesses and overnight parking. The secondary purpose was to discuss how parking permits are handled to accommodate apartment residents. As you recall, there has been concern expressed by the apartment owners that it becomes very difficult for them to rent apartments unless some type of overnight parking is available.

At your meeting, Jim Lynch will review a proposal he has developed to create additional parking spaces that would serve North Oakland Avenue between East Capitol Drive and the north Village limits. This project is part of the CDA's work to complete the Oakland Avenue TIF project.

In addition, staff is modifying overnight parking procedures. Previously, a resident who had applied to buy a permit in a lot that was full was allowed to pay to be on a waiting list for the lot. They were then allowed to park on the street for the balance of the month at no cost. If a parking lot space was not available at the end of the month, the resident had to pay \$3 per night for overnight street parking.

This is being modified. The procedure for signing up for the parking lot waiting list does not change. Parking on the street continues to be assessed at \$3 per day, but may be paid for a month in advance.

As Executive Director of the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD), I feel it is important to share key issues and challenges regarding wastewater treatment and the future of clean water. To keep our customers and other interested individuals up to date, we are sharing these brief reports by email.

The Inside Scoop

Power Concerns: Recent blackouts in the northeast highlight our society's dependence on reliable power sources. As manager of a critical utility, I wondered what would have happened if a massive and lengthy power failure hit our region. Recently, I instructed our staff to evaluate MMSD's readiness in the event of a similar crisis. I'm happy to report that, thanks to the Y-2-K concerns of 1999 and the investment in the Deep Tunnel, MMSD is ready to provide uninterrupted service in the event of a massive power failure.

MMSD operates two treatment plants that each cleans an average of 100 million gallons of wastewater per day. We also have the Deep Tunnel that can store 405 million gallons of rain and wastewater.

If a massive blackout hits our region, MMSD has enough power generation capacity to operate the Jones Island Wastewater Treatment Plant, which can treat 330 million gallons of wastewater per day. A lengthy power failure would force us to shut down our South Shore plant and close the gates to the sewers that transport flow to South Shore. However, those flows would be stored in the Deep Tunnel and pumped to Jones Island.

MMSD could operate in this crisis mode for an extended period of time, as long as the area did not receive significant rainfall. The system could handle a small storm in this mode of operation, but a large storm could overburden the system.

While I hope this is an operation we never have to implement, it is re-assuring to know that we are unlikely to experience the environmental disasters faced by some major communities out East.

Public Involvement: I am a strong advocate of getting public input on projects that affect this region and are paid for by our customers. MMSD is currently involved in a major public involvement process as part of our Water Quality Initiative. This is a long-range planning effort to identify this area's needs by 2020 to protect and improve water quality, accommodate growth, and sustain and attract good paying jobs. We are working with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and the Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission on this project.

Without public involvement and input, we would forfeit all opportunities to obtain federal funding or low interest (clean water fund) federal loans. Clean water fund loans have saved MMSD customers millions of dollars over the years. If you just look at the clean water fund loans for MMSD projects from 2001 through 2004, taxpayers will save nearly \$50 million in interest because the District pays lower financing rates on clean water fund loans compared to general obligation bonds.

The Water Quality Initiative will directly impact all of you! We need strong public involvement and we believe the final product will be much better if it does have everyone's input.

We started this process a little over a year ago. The planning and engineering have been ongoing. Putting the proper resources into this effort has been a strain. MMSD staff took on this herculean effort last September and did a very good job of laying the groundwork and setting up the structure for the various groups to have their input heard. They developed the outreach plan.

Since we began this planning effort, our MMSD Commission has asked us to focus on the entire watershed area. By doing this, MMSD has expanded the planning and public involvement area from 420 square miles to 1,200 square miles. Adding more area means more meetings, which will require more resources than the District has in house.

In July, MMSD Commissioners approved an \$804,000 contract to implement our public involvement plan. During the development of the plan, MMSD also contracted out a variety of tasks to supplement our staff's effort where internal expertise was lacking. That extra work totaled around \$97,000 over a 15-month timeframe. Now, the real work begins!

While we strive to provide the best service at the lowest possible cost, I believe this effort is vital to our region and this expenditure is going to pay for itself many times over in the future by making sure projects and resources meet the needs of the entire region.

Finally: I would like to provide an update on the disturbing discovery of condoms in the inner harbor in Milwaukee. Undeniably, some of these items are getting into the water from MMSD's Jones Island treatment plant and that is very troubling.

We have gone through the entire plant to find the source of the problem and have yet to identify an exact cause. But, we are mitigating the impact. We have had full time monitoring of our discharge into Lake Michigan for the entire summer. We have hired people to walk through our plant and net any condoms they find in the final treatment process.

Additionally, we are working on a system of quarter-inch mesh screens to capture these items. We will soon ask the MMSD Commission for authority to move forward with this \$1.7 million project.

We are not taking this lightly. We are very concerned about this problem and doing everything possible to make sure it does not continue.

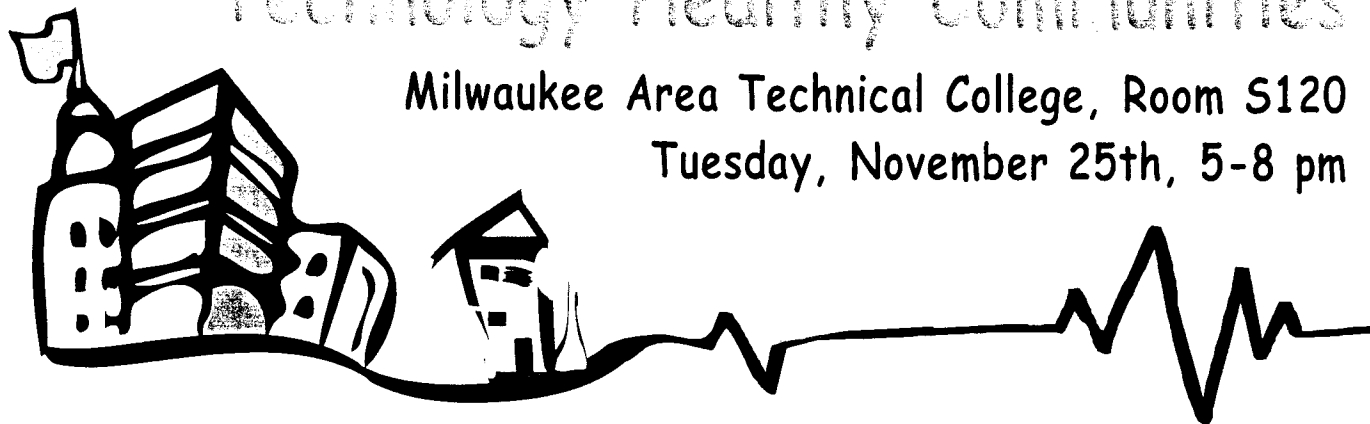

## Employees Paying Ever-Bigger Share for Health Care

By MILT FREUDENHEIM

**P**eople in employer-sponsored health plans are paying 48 percent more out of their own pockets for care than they did three years ago, according to an authoritative new study, and the cost will be even higher next year.

Almost two-thirds of large employers raised the amounts that employees are contributing to the cost of their health plans this year, and 79 percent say they will do so again in 2004, according to the study, by the Kaiser Family Foundation and the Health Research and Educational Trust.

Other health care experts are projecting that 2004 will be the fourth straight year of double-digit increases in health insurance premiums.

The steady climb in costs has made health care benefits a hot issue in labor negotiations this year, and it has put pressure on Congress to reach agreement on adding a drug benefit to Medicare. The sponsors of the study said yesterday that health care costs were also a significant drag on the economy.

"Workers pay substantially more, companies raise prices and they hire fewer people," said Drew Altman, president of the Kaiser Family Foundation, which specializes in health care issues.

Out-of-pocket spending for insurance premiums, deductibles and drug co-payments rose to \$2,790 this year for a typical employee with family coverage, from \$1,890 in 2000, Mr. Altman said.

Over all, according to the Kaiser study, health care premiums rose 13.9 percent this year, the biggest increase since 1990, outpacing the 11 percent rise in spending for hospitals and doctors, and far ahead of the 2.4 percent increase in manufacturers' prices. The increase was 15.6 percent for small employers with fewer than 300 workers.

Health care economists say that the rising costs reflect advances in drugs and health care technology and a loosening of managed care restraints during the prosperous 1990's.

Employers still pay the bulk of the costs — typically at least 75 percent. But the study found that most employers are shifting more costs to workers, in hopes of lowering the expense by discouraging heavy use of doctors, hospitals and prescription drugs.

Deductibles and co-payments for hospital care, which were uncommon only a few years ago, were required by 4 in 10 plans this year, the study found, and higher co-payments for expensive prescription drugs have been widely adopted.

"Given the state of the economy and the rapid rate of inflation, I don't think we have seen the worst of increased cost-sharing with employees," said Jon Gabel, vice president of the Health Research and Educational Trust, a nonprofit group based in Washington. The study is based on the responses of 928 employers to a survey about their health care spending.

In a typical example, state employees in Ohio will face increases in deductibles, co-payments for doctor visits and some drugs, and higher ceilings on out-of-pocket costs next year. But in a tradeoff with the state employees' unions, Ohio has postponed a 50 percent rise in the workers' share of insurance premiums to July 2005.

Benefit consultants said the health care inflation rate would slow somewhat next year — in part, they said, as workers respond to higher out-of-pocket costs by curtailing their use of some expensive drugs and avoiding some less-than-urgent hospital procedures.

"The rate of elective surgeries such as knee surgery is declining," said Kenneth Sperling, a health care consultant with Hewitt Associates.

In addition, spending on allergy drugs is declining after the switch of Claritin to nonprescription status. Employers expect a similar cost dip for ulcer and heartburn remedies when Prilosec, another widely used drug, becomes available in stores without a prescription next week. The switch to over-the-counter sales, however, usually means that the drugs are no longer covered by health plans, so consumers must pay the full price.

Still, based on early insurance contracts reported by large employers, the increases in premiums for the coming 12 months will be substantial.

"It does look bleak again, looking forward to 2004," said Joseph Martingale, a health benefits consultant with Watson Wyatt. Mr. Sperling said he expected the increase in premiums to fall below 12 percent.

The slowdown in spending for drugs and hospitals is good news for large employers, which typically pay medical bills directly, even if the paperwork is handled by an insurer.

But insurers and health plans have not passed those savings along to small businesses. Because their premiums were based on last year's health costs, "2003 was a very profitable year for the managed care industry," Mr. Sperling said.

Employers' health plans cover 175 million people, including 160 million workers and their families and 15 million retirees.

According to the new study, 65 percent of employers increased the amount that employees pay for health insurance this year, 47 percent raised employees' payments for prescription drugs, 34 percent increased deductibles and 34 percent raised co-payments for doctor visits.

Mr. Sperling, the Hewitt consultant, said many large employers added \$100 deductibles for hospital visits three years ago. This year, most of the 300 companies that he monitors raised the deductible to \$200, and one in four large employers is planning a further increase to \$250 in 2004, he said.

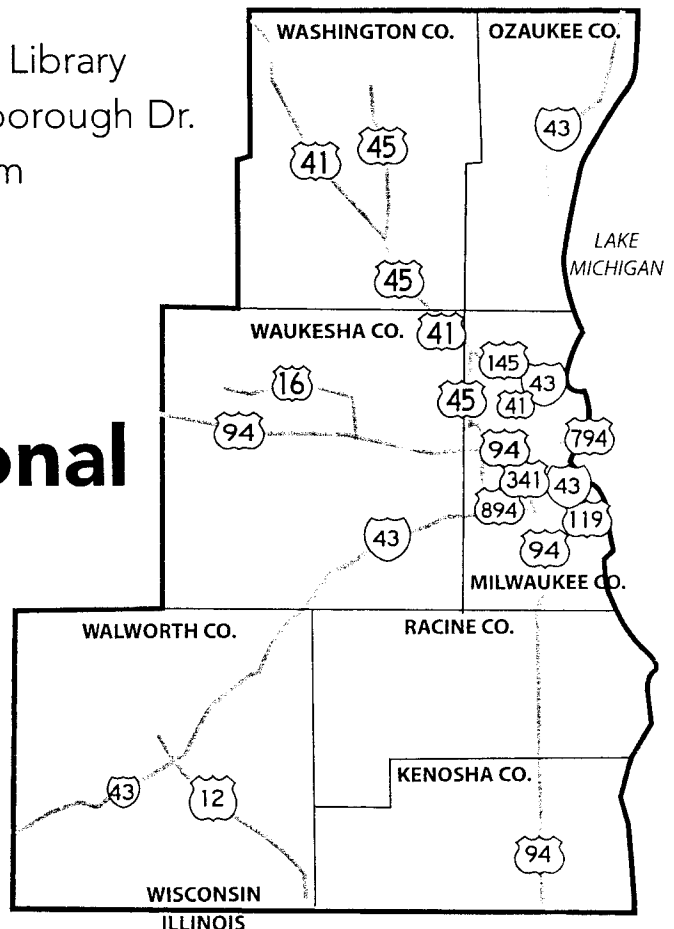

The facility at 2420 E. Capitol Drive will have 34 rooms. Nineteen parking spaces are included in their lease agreement. They will use 8-foot high temporary wall partitions. The rooms have no ceilings so that the heat will escape. The aisles are 5 feet

2 inches wide, and each door is 30 inches wide. They will be adding more air

conditioning. They hope to open in the fall of 2002.

Ms. Langenkamp asked who will manage the store since they live in Sturgeon Bay. Each store has its own manager.

Mr. Hunt questioned the large size of the store. Mr. Nesbitt explained that they use multiple levels of equipment and take no appointments, so there is a large volume of customers.

There will be approximately 30 employees, two to five at any time. The store will be open between 7 A.M. and 11 P.M., seven days a week.

Mr. Rebholz asked if any state licensing is required. A State of Wisconsin permit is required, and the facility must meet certain criteria.

Mr. Rebholz asked what equipment is included in each room. In addition to the tanning bed, each room has a chair, a mirror, a wall light, and hooks for clothing.

Ms. Langenkamp moved that the Plan Commission make the findings a-g under Shorewood Ordinance 305C(3) with approval subject to a successful application to the State of Wisconsin and continued adherence to State HFS standards, and that the Plan Commission approve a Conditional Use Permit for Daniel Nesbitt to operate a tanning salon at 2420 E. Today's Milwaukee *Journal Sentinel* included the following story regarding liability insurance. The link is also included.

Some of the information in the story might be a bit misleading. The League of Wisconsin Municipalities has operated a liability insurance program for a number of years. Until two years ago the plan was provided through Wausau Insurance. For a variety of reasons, the League dropped Wausau and went with Kemper.

The Village of Shorewood had participated in the League program for a number of years, but after consultation with the T.E. Brennan, Village's liability insurance consultant, it was decided to stay with Wausau, rather than continue with the League and Kemper. Quotes from both and were basically the same. The consultant's main concern was that Kemper was offering coverage that seemed unrealistic and not fiscally prudent for an insurance company to offer. We were not surprised that Kemper backed out after just two years, but not because of terrorism which has negatively affected all liability carriers. A number of municipalities had similar concerns and stayed with Wausau.

When the Cities & Villages Mutual Insurance Company was formed in 1987, the Village of Shorewood chose not to participate because of the risk though it was invited to nearly every year. The Village has used this to its advantage in getting competitive rates from Wausau. We are a little reluctant to participate in the League's latest venture just yet, but will consider it in the future should it prove to be successful.

**Insurance co-op created for cities, villages  
 Move prompted by firm dropping coverage over terror attacks**

The threat of terrorism has persuaded an insurance carrier to drop liability coverage for about 200 cities and villages in Wisconsin, leading to the formation of a new statewide self-insurance cooperative.

As part of a corporate retrenching attributed to terrorist threats, Kemper Insurance Cos. has decided not to renew coverage under a nearly 20-year-old program operated by the League of Wisconsin Municipalities.

The program insures about 200 municipalities against such common government mishaps as pedestrians injured on public sidewalks, police officers or firefighters hurt on the job, and motorists colliding with city vehicles.



With Kemper dropping out at the end of the year, League of Wisconsin Municipalities officials have invested \$5 million to establish a new self-insurance pool of the sort that became popular during an insurance industry crunch in the 1980s.

But some affected cities and villages are shopping around for other options to protect themselves and their taxpayers from liability.

Well the weather is turning – leaves are just about all gone – and we are all looking forward to the holidays. But well the calendar year is fast approaching its end – the fiscal year for the Shorewood Men's Club has barely begun – but we know that it too, will find its end much sooner than we are ready for it. Now is the time that we must be diligent so that we don't procrastinate and find ourselves with too little time left to properly prepare for our annual events, and to finish new business that we start.

### JOB DESCRIPTIONS:

Most of us are acquainted with "job descriptions" from the places we work. They are especially useful when there is a transition in a job from one person to another – the new person has a guideline to follow in the performance of their duties.

Unfortunately, the SMC does not have such guidelines for the different things that we do. All of the knowledge and needed expertise involved in running various events, such as the Chicken Barbeque, the Family Day Picnic and the National Night Out, is locked away in various members brains. Even the smaller things such as working with the Hubbard Lodge, planning the various special events, and interfacing with the Village employees, are not readily available for review and/or revision.

In order to preserve this working knowledge of the Club, and to help in future planning and past performance reviews, we are going to put together a "Job Description" manual for the SMC. Bill Shimeta has volunteered to type the manual – but he will need the information for the specifics from those who know.

I am asking all committee chairs, and all of those members who are involved in the various functions of the SMC to write down the details of what they do, how they do, the normal costs involved, etc. Also, very helpful will be the names and phone numbers of any third parties (vendors, DPW contacts, etc.) that we need to contact. Upon completion of their written description, they should provide a copy to Bill and a copy to me. In light of the upcoming holidays, I know that there will not be much time left to provide those descriptions this year, but I would like to establish a deadline of January 31<sup>st</sup> for having the materials to Bill. Thank you all in advance for your cooperation.

### SCHOLARSHIP FUND

At the last SMC Board of Directors meeting, I asked the Board for approval to approach SHS with an idea for a scholarship endowment in the name of the Shorewood Men's Club, aimed towards graduates of SHS who are pursuing a technical track after high school. The idea would be to use SMC funds (perhaps up to \$10,000) as seed money to raise the \$1 million needed for the endowment. The Board did not authorize an expenditure or commitment at this time, but they did authorize me to start a dialogue with SHS.

I had the opportunity to meet with Rick Monroe (SHS Principal) and Mary Kay Anderson (SHS Food Science and Family Consumer Relations) in regards to establishing the Scholarship Endowment. They were very enthusiastic about the idea, and thought that it would be incredibly useful for SHS graduates. Some of the information I learned from them was:

- 1) There is presently the Shaw Endowment, which provides scholarship money for SHS graduates who are going on to 4 year schools. Although the Shaw Endowment is a little over \$1 million at this point, it can only be used for a maximum of 3 graduating SHS students per year, due to the 4 year need for each student, and the higher costs of the 4 year schools. The Shaw Scholarship pays \$10,000 per year per student.
- 2) Students who are in every way qualified for a Shaw Scholarship, but miss it due to it being only available for 3 graduates, fall way down in available monies to the \$500 to \$1500 per year range. Often times this is not enough for graduates from less fortunate families to fund their post secondary school education.
- 3) Mr. Monroe and Ms. Anderson thought that a similar endowment for technical school bound students could benefit as many as 12 graduates per year, or more, based upon the shorter cycle of two years, and the lower costs of technical school credits.
- 4) They also pointed out that some of the scholarships would benefit those who are strictly going for a two year degree --- but would also help those who are in the 2/2 program. The 2/2 program is a joint program between the UW System and the WI Technical School System (17 schools throughout WI) which allows the students to enroll in a WI Technical School for the first two years, in a program that fully transfer their credits to a 4 year UW School for the completion of their 4 year degree.
- 5) Rick and Mary Kay have promised that they will work on preparing a statement for need, which can be presented to the SMC Board and Members, and also a presentation that we can schedule for one of our Wednesday meetings.

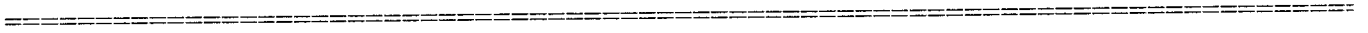

**Subject:** Patriotic Bunting

I have received two phone calls regarding whether the Village is going to have any patriotic visual displays supporting U.S. troops in Iraq. One caller, who left a message, indicated that other communities are doing it. I observed that Glendale, Whitefish Bay, and Fox Point have no public displays. Others in the office I spoke with had not seen anything elsewhere either.

The Village purchased and has displayed red, white and blue bunting on streetlights in the business district following the September 11, 2001 tragedy, when there was great unity in this country. We also used it for the 2002 July 4<sup>th</sup> holiday.

This time deciding what to do is more difficult. There certainly seems to be considerable differences regarding the War in Iraq as noted by the signs around the Village showing opposition to the war. I am not sure whether residents would see the bunting as support for our soldiers or for the war and the administration. I must admit that my thoughts on this are colored by my service as an U.S. Army Infantry officer during a very unpopular war. My inclination is to put up the bunting and leave it up through July 4<sup>th</sup>.

Please let me know if you have any objections to the Village putting up the red, white, and blue bunting.

You may have read the attached article in Sunday's *Milwaukee Journal Sentinel*. Jim Wronski noted some major errors in the article and has tried to contact the *Journal* reporter. This year there have not been as many sales in that price range. This obviously affected the average. Data to date seems to show that Shorewood homes continue to increase in value.

## Sales, prices of homes increase

### But some hot spots in metro area cool off

Powered by houses selling for less than \$200,000, sales of metro Milwaukee existing homes rose 6.8% in the first half of 2002, compared with the first half of last year.

Average prices climbed between 6% and 15% higher in many communities, according to the July market analysis from Metro Multiple Listing Service.

Still, some former hot spots cooled: Shorewood's prices dropped about \$35,000 and Farmington's, about \$17,000. Dips were reported in Richfield, Mukwonago and Belgium, down about \$9,000, \$8,000 and \$6,000, respectively.

Sales of existing homes through June 30 showed the best market performance in three years for Milwaukee, Waukesha, Ozaukee and Washington Counties - 8,512, compared with 7,967 in the first half of 2001 and 7,509 in the first half of 2000, data from the Wauwatosa-based realty tracking firm shows.

"First-time homeowners, especially in Milwaukee, and especially with interest rates at 6.5% (for a 30-year mortgage) have been the determining factor," said Donald J. Horning, president of Brookfield-based Shorewest Realtors, one of Wisconsin's largest volume home sellers.

Average prices climbed in nearly every municipality, led by gains in rural areas such as Genesee, which was up more than \$80,000, and Nashotah, which was up about \$63,000. Hikes of \$20,000 or more were recorded in Bayside, Brookfield, Cedarburg, Delafield, Elm Grove, Mequon, River Hills, Saukville, Wales and Whitefish Bay.

Volatility in the stock market and historically low money market rates could explain why more cash is flowing into real estate.

"People look at the stock market losses, look at the appreciation rates they can have, and they buy a home," Horning said. "We hit the spectrum of the market - from \$1.5 million to \$50,000, and our average unit price is up 8.1% this year. To increase that much is beyond our expectations."

The market's pinnacle was tiny River Hills, where average home price rose to \$657,747 from \$620,250 last year. A distant second - Delafield in Waukesha County's lake country - averaged \$366,118, up from \$331,683 last year.

At the market's bottom, the City of Milwaukee became the area's last municipality to cross the \$100,000 border, climbing to a \$101,341 average sales price this year from \$94,287 a year ago.

"You wonder what could we have in place, if anything, for those who can't afford a \$125,000 house?" commented Michael D. Holloway, president of buyer-agent-only Homebuyer Associates in Shorewood.

Credit metro Milwaukee's prosperous housing market to the dyspeptic economy, whose slogging pace has kept mortgage interest rates near 30-year lows and whose financial market losses have turned disillusioned investors to the simple value of homes, said Metro MLS President Gary Gerhardt, a broker and owner of Re/Max Realty 100 in Brookfield.

"It's surprising that our run has continued. Typically, real estate markets run in cycles, but the numbers just keep getting better and better." Gerhardt said.

"It's an incredible scenario."

There's a distinct caution among shoppers - sales times are running a few days to a few weeks longer than last year, and prices have softened in the over-\$300,000 market and in far-flung areas, Gerhardt said.

"But there's evidence that the market is very, very strong, and fast, up to \$200,000. Look at Milwaukee County - average 68 days on market, average price \$129,565. Look at the least sales time - West Allis, a good, solid place where average price is \$118,000," he said.

In Ozaukee County, site of the state's highest average sales prices and some of the area's longest work-home commutes, average sales times are 50% longer, Gerhardt noted.

"Price and proximity to Milwaukee seem to have a definite effect on the market," he said.

Robin Fazio, co-owner of Buyers Vantage, a discount realty brokerage in Brookfield and Madison, put it this way:

"The higher the price range, the more days on market. For \$150,000 - that's the first-time home buyer market in Waukesha - buyers are pretty plentiful. In the \$189,000-to-\$219,000 range, houses seem to go really quickly. Above that, people start questioning whether this is what they want to do, waiting to see what the economy does."

The typical Buyers Vantage listing sold for \$210,000 last year and \$240,000 this year, Fazio said. "But our days on market are longer - 43 this year, and it was 30 last year. And we're seeing signs that the buyer pool is not as plentiful."

Also not as plentiful are buyers ready to pay what some overconfident Shorewood sellers are asking.

Shorewood's market is paying the price for what Holloway called "the panic mentality" gripping the North Shore suburb last year as strong demand heated to fever-pitch. Average prices shot up nearly \$60,000 amid multiple bids and even an occasional auction in a small - 79 sales in all 2001 - market."

Shorewood's price bubble popped, and for a simple reason - "people just couldn't afford it anymore," Holloway said. "Maybe you can buy at \$200,000, but you can't at \$225,000."

Panic mentality is a rarity in metro Milwaukee's steady-if-not-staid market, but Holloway said even he fell victim to it.

"I sold my house this year and it sold within 60 days but I hung my hat on what the stock market calls irrational exuberance. I know my house was worth \$235,000 to \$240,000. I'm a professional at pricing, after all, but when a house three doors over, probably not as nice, sold in the \$250,000 area, I priced mine at \$256,000.

"In 10 days, I realized my mistake. Tons of people looked at it, but it wasn't going to sell. So I priced it at \$249,000 and it sold for \$240,000."

## **BLUE SKY MEETING - APRIL 29, 2002 - NOTES**

All members of the Village Board, Ray Pollen, Leeann Butschlick, and Edward Madere attended the meeting.

President Dow followed the printed agenda. Following are items from the discussion.

- \$ It was requested that an organizational chart of the Village be provided.
- \$ It was asked that a list of various Village boards, commissions and committees along with their responsibilities, status, etc. be provided to the Board.
- \$ A letter to be sent to Shorewood Responds asking that meetings be held at a time when all members may participate.
- \$ Schedule a meeting for the Village President to meet with the chairpersons of all the boards, commissions and committees.
- \$ School operating expenses and potential impact on property taxes was discussed. It was asked that information be sought from the school concerning this.
- \$ The annual Village/School joint meeting should be scheduled.
- \$ There was a discussion on long-range planning. It was indicated that the costs would be in the \$25,000 - \$40,000 range. Staff was asked to develop Requests for Proposals.
- \$ It was noted that the schools, zoning code, land use etc. should be included as part of the long-range planning process. This item was assigned to the Development and Long Range Planning Committee.
- \$ Quality of life issues:
  - S Concern was expressed about noise caused by leaf blowers, weed whackers, etc.
  - S Need to encourage landscaping/beautification - similar to Image Enhancement Committee award - perhaps involve Garden Room
  - S There was a perception that crime in certain parts of the community B need to improve public relations - consider revitalizing Block Watch Program.
  - S
- \$ Under shared services: Should meet with Whitefish Bay officials and perhaps with all North Shore municipal officials about shared services, working together, etc.
- \$ Elderly services were praised. It was noted that the elderly can also provide services as

professionals.

- \$ Under community recreation
  - S It was noted that the old school pool is in bad shape. Jack Linehan should be contacted regarding its status.
  - S The beach equipment was questioned and it was felt that the old children=s play equipment should be movedBperhaps new equipment could be purchased through fund-raising, Shorewood Foundation, Business Improvement District, etc.
  
- \$ Under Business District -
  - S There was some discussion regarding staff.
  - S Concern was raised about the intersection of Jarvis and Oakland that there should be a lined crosswalk at that intersection. There is also concern about the driveway at Sendik=s and indicated that John Nehring was amenable to closing the driveway. This tied in to the concerns raised about the need to reverse the entrance and exits of Sendik=s parking lot.
  
- \$ Discussion on e-mail indicated that those messages are subject to open records law. Mr. Pollen is going to provide information on this.
  
- \$ The issue of residency was raised regarding management staff and whether the Village Board should adopt a policy requiring that new hires for management be required to live in the Village. A best practices comparison, that is what other communities are doing, was raised.
  
- \$ Concern was expressed that the Village did not observe the Martin Luther King Jr. Holiday. It was noted that while the unions have requested the holiday, they have not been willing to give up another holiday in exchange. It was also noted by staff that the Good Friday Holiday, now known as Spring Holiday, was awkward. An effort will be made to exchange the Spring Holiday for the Martin Luther King Jr. Holiday.
  
- \$ It was suggested that the Village do a community survey in the near future. It was noted that this might be included as part of the long-range planning process.

The meeting adjourned at approximately 9:50 p.m.

## ➔ **McCallum Kills Campaign Finance Reform**

Last week the Senate considered and gave preliminary approval to Senate Bill 104, the comprehensive campaign finance reform measure introduced by Sen. Mike Ellis (R-Neenah) and supported by the League. This week, because Governor McCallum refused to pledge that he would not partially veto the bill, the Senate declined to take a final vote on SB 104. Senate Majority Leader Chvala has said that the

Senate needs written assurance from the Governor that he will not use his partial veto powers to upset the bipartisan compromise contained in SB 104.

## Recently Introduced Legislation

Recently introduced bills and joint resolutions relevant to local government are summarized below. The committee that the bill or joint resolution has been referred to is designated in parentheses. An asterisk (\*) indicates the bill is scheduled for a public hearing. More information on hearings is provided below under "Public Hearing Schedule for Upcoming Week."

### **AB 766 Immunity For Use Of Solid Waste in Public Projects**

By Rep. Kedzie, Sen. Schultz By Request of DNR. Under current law, the department of natural resources (DNR) may characterize a solid waste as a special waste available for beneficial use in a public works project and must maintain a list of those characterized solid wastes in a format that is available to the public. Under this bill, solid wastes that DNR has exempted from the normal disposal requirement are considered special wastes and may be characterized by DNR as suitable for beneficial use in public works projects. This bill requires DNR to maintain a list of those special wastes that are suitable for use in specified types of public works projects. The list may include conditions under which the wastes may be used in public works projects. Under the bill, the current provisions granting immunity from liability apply to the use of those listed special wastes in public works projects if the conditions established by DNR for their use are met. In addition, the current law provisions prohibiting immunity for acts of reckless, wanton, or intentional misconduct or that result in the death or injury of an individual apply. (Committee On Environment)

### **AB 768 Adoption of Internal Revenue Code Changes**

By Rep. Krawczyk, Sen. Burke. This bill adopts, for income tax purposes, the changes to the federal Internal Revenue Code made by the individual income and pension and individual retirement arrangement provisions of the federal Economic Growth and Tax Relief Reconciliation Act of 2001, excluding the section related to a deduction for higher education expenses which is similar to a deduction allowed under current state law. (Joint Committee On Finance. Referred To Joint Committee On Tax Exemptions)

### **SB 411 Authorizing the City Of Bayfield to Become a Premier Resort Area**

By Sen. Jauch, Rep. Sherman. This bill allows the city of Bayfield to become a premier resort area notwithstanding the fact that it does not meet the generally applicable requirement that at least 40% of the equalized assessed value of the taxable property within a political subdivision be used by tourism-related retailers. A premier resort area may impose a tax at a rate of 0.5% of the gross receipts from the sale, lease, or rental of goods or services that are subject to the general sales and use tax and are sold by tourism-related retailers. The proceeds of the tax may only be used to pay for "infrastructure expenses" within the jurisdiction of the premier resort area. The definition of "infrastructure expenses" includes the costs of purchasing, constructing, or improving parking lots; transportation facilities, including roads and bridges; sewer and water facilities; recreational facilities; fire fighting equipment; and police vehicles. (Committee On Insurance, Tourism, And Transportation)

### **SB 412 Revisions and Additions to Condominium Law.**

By Joint Legislative Council. This bill revises and makes comprehensive changes to the laws governing the creation and operation of condominiums. The bill makes the following changes to laws governing municipal regulation of condominiums:

1. Clarifies, with editorial changes, the prohibition on imposing requirements under zoning or other land use ordinances or regulations that discriminate against the condominium form of ownership.
2. Clarifies the prohibition on applying a provision of a state or local building code differently to a building in a condominium than it would be applied if the building were under a different form of ownership, unless the different application is expressly permitted by the building code. Further clarifies that if the different application is expressly permitted, it must be reasonably related to the nature of condominium ownership. Similarly, clarifies that no subdivision ordinance may apply to a condominium unless, as currently required, the ordinance is expressly applicable to condominiums and, as added by the bill, its application is reasonably related to the nature of condominium ownership.
3. Clarifies the prohibition against enactment of any law, ordinance or regulation that would impose a burden or restriction on a condominium that is not imposed on all other property of similar character not subjected to a condominium declaration to specify that the law, ordinance or regulation may not impose a "greater" burden or restriction and, additionally, may not provide a lower level of service to a condominium than would be imposed or provided if the condominium were under a different form of ownership.

Dear Governor McCallum:

I am writing to express the concerns of the Village of Shorewood Board of Trustees concerning your recently proposed Budget Reform Bill and to provide several recommendations regarding it.

The Village has learned that under your proposed plan it would have its 2002 state shared revenue of \$831,577 reduced by 65% to 293,708, and that the entire amount would be eliminated in 2004. The knowledge of this reduction came, of course, after the Village Board had approved the 2002 Village budget. That budget contained a property tax levy increase of 1.5%, which, as I am sure you can appreciate was reached after considerable deliberation. Your proposed reduction in State aid for 2002 would equal a 7% property tax increase. The elimination of state aid in 2004 would mean an even larger increase.

It is not the intent of the Village Board to attempt to recoup the proposed reduction solely through property tax increases. Before such a property tax increase is considered the Board will carefully consider other alternatives to include service reduction, fees for service, privatization, and consolidation/cooperation with other public and private agencies. As I am sure you are aware, the Village of Shorewood along with its north shore neighbors has probably the highest level of shared public services in Wisconsin. For example, to our knowledge, the North Shore Fire Department is still the largest public safety consolidation to have occurred in the State.

Regardless of the specific causes, the Village Board recognizes that the State is in a financial crisis and that municipalities, among others must be part of the solution. Shorewood is willing to do its share. However, the solution should be a result of dialogue not demand. The Village Board believes that a process involving cooperation, not confrontation, should be followed.

The Village Board urges you to immediately create the commission on local government finances you recommended in your proposed Bill to debate and develop solutions to the issues which are affected by and in some case contributed to the large State deficit. At a minimum, such topics as unfunded state mandates, aid to education and municipalities, campaign finance reform, cooperation agreements, and state government revenues and expenditures should be on the table. It is important that this discussion begin immediately so that there is ample time to begin to develop solutions before the November election.



The Village is listing concerns and developing ideas which it will share with Senator Darling and Representative Wasserman as its immediate contribution to the above process.

Dear Rod and Ed:

I will be travelling on business on Monday in Dallas and will be unable to attend the board meeting.

Two issues I would like to comment on that are agenda items for Monday's meeting. Can you please make my comments known when these agenda items are in discussion during the regular board meeting and the committee meeting for Streets and Buildings.

1. The financing plan proposed at our last meeting with Keith Kolb. Based on the information that was shared by staff and Mr. Kolb at our last meeting, I feel strongly that we, as a board need a "compelling" reason to proceed forward with the proposed restructuring of our debt. If any of the following criteria were evident: 1. A "significant cost savings"; 2. A reduction in the term of the loan (s). Possibly I missed something in Mr. Kolb's presentation, but with the facts as they were presented, I heard both staff and Mr. Kolb state that the primary reason for proposing this restructuring was the benefit of "evening" out the bumps in debt service for 3-4 years based on the library project's increase in our overall debt load.

What I want to be perfectly clear about from my perspective is that we do not go down a road that will (by this proposed restructuring) "hide" this debt in such a way that we no longer "see" the long term capital expenditures that Shorewood makes. This can have the effect of minimizing our taxpayer's knowledge and understanding as to why their taxes are at a given level or what "cause/effect" relationship our tax rate has on capital spending decisions we make. It is critically important, in my opinion, that the average tax payer can understand his tax rate (over a period of time), with simplicity, straight forward answers from the Village, and transparency as to our decisions affecting the long term debt of the Village. As there certainly exist many possibilities for further capital expenditures in future years in Shorewood (Schools, Police Station, etc.); we need to be extremely conscious of the decisions we are currently making to insure they are in the best long term interests of our fellow tax payers. What I would never want to happen is that a decision such as this proposed "restructuring" has the effect of paving the way for future capital spending by giving the appearance (incorrectly) that "our taxes never went up" as a result of the library project" or any other large scale spending projects taken on by the Village.

2. The agenda item for Streets and Buildings. I received phone calls from several residents whose property is immediately adjacent to the proposed street improvement program in the northwest end of the Village. The survey that was sent out includes many properties who are not adjacent to the improvements and thus would not be affected near the level as those with properties next to the improvement in question. My fear is that we are pushing proposed modifications on residents who may not desire them. I would not support the proposed modifications unless the property owners immediately adjacent to the modifications were in full support of the project.

RE: Village Hall Historic Designation

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In the fall of last year, I was asked to review the impact of the placement of the Shorewood Village Hall on to the National Register of Historic Places. Specifically, this related to questions as to whether the garage additions to the Village Hall were included or excluded from the historic designation. My review led to my November 10, 2000 memo describing the legal issues involved and the recommendation to maintain Mr. H. Russell Zimmermann to provide advice on how to proceed. (11/10/00 Memo w/out attachments - attached).

Mr. Zimmermann's review has now been completed and a copy of his report is attached. His basic conclusion is that the inclusion of the garage and auxiliary building as part of the historical nomination was either an error in draftsmanship or an error in historical analysis.



If Mr. Zimmermann had come to the conclusion that the garage buildings were of historical significance, it was to be my recommendation that we provide a supplement to the record before the State to make that clear. This would also clarify the Village's own records with respect to preservation obligations. Where, Mr. Zimmermann has come to the conclusion that historical significance to the garage structures is absent, I believe it is most appropriate to submit documents to the state clarifying the record, the intent of the original nomination and the reasons why there should be no preservation responsibilities. Because these responsibilities exist both under Shorewood ordinances and state statutes, I believe that attempts to clarify the status of the garage buildings and to remove them from the historical nomination record is appropriate whether or not future design plans for the library could call for altering or razing the buildings.

I would like to proceed with a request to remove them from the nomination application. It may also be appropriate to request a review of this matter by the Shorewood Historical Society since it was that group that initiated the nomination procedures in the first instance. I believe it would be appropriate to share Mr. Zimmermann's report with the Shorewood Historical Society and ask for its support in clarifying the status of the garage buildings. Based on my review, it would appear that restricting the scope of the historical designation application is consistent with the position the Village Board took in 1984. (See Minutes portions - attached). As a result, it would not appear that new Board action is required to authorize this submission. Pending review by the Shorewood Historical Society, I will withhold any action or request to the State Historical Society. If there is any Board Member who believes that this should be an agenda item for discussion or if any Board Member has questions or comments regarding this matter, please feel free to contact me or Mr. Madere.

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From 1995 through 1998 I occasionally provided a "pending litigation memo" to the Board as an update on various matters in suit in which the Village was involved. As litigation was reduced, so were the memos. Given the latest suits, I will try to keep the Board posted on various litigation matters. At any time, if you should have questions or comments about pending matters that are in litigation, do not hesitate to contact me.

**NANKIN v. SHOREWOOD**

This is a declaratory judgment action filed on behalf of the owner of property at N. Murray Avenue. Through their attorney, the owner is seeking a declaration that the statute applicable to appeal a decision of the Shorewood Board of Appeals is unconstitutional. This case originally came before the Milwaukee County Circuit Court and Judge Diane Sykes supported the Village's position and dismissed the claim. Later, the case was appealed to the Wisconsin Court of Appeals which affirmed the trial court's decision and dismissed all claims. The case was petitioned to the State Supreme Court which accepted the review. The briefing process is underway and oral argument and a decision will be expected in the Spring.

**LEVINSON v. SHOREWOOD**

This is an action filed in the Milwaukee County Circuit Court seeking damages from an incident which occurred on July 4, 2000. Mr. Levinson attempted to step into the street in a construction area on E. Stratford; he caught his foot in the excavated area and fell. The matter has been tendered to the Village's insurer and also the insurer for the contractor which had undertaken this street construction project.

**SCHIMENZ v. SHOREWOOD**

In this case, Catherine Schimenz challenges the decision of the building inspector which allowed the construction of a six-foot fence along the rear lot line of her property on E. Glendale Avenue. Through her attorney, she asserts that the Village ordinance must be interpreted to allow only a four-foot fence. She originally appealed to the Board of Appeals which affirmed the decision of the building inspector and this matter is now pending in the Milwaukee County Circuit Court where her appeal continues. An answer to Ms. Schimenz will be filed in the circuit court in January.

**STATHAS v. SHOREWOOD**

Mr. Stathas is an abutting property owner to the property at 4601 N. Oakland Avenue. He has filed suit seeking to challenge the decision of the Board of Appeals to grant a variance to the developer of that property which reduces the number of parking spaces required under the Village code. The suit also seeks to challenge the authority of the Board of Appeals to grant a special exception to that same developer on the parking requirement. Contemporaneously, counsel for Mr. Stathas has also filed a complaint with the Milwaukee County Corporation Counsel's office seeking to challenge the authority of the Board of Appeals to deliberate in closed session. An answer to Mr. Stathas' original complaint has been filed and an answer to the amended complaint will be filed in January.

**NORTH SHORE INVESTORS v. SHOREWOOD BOARD OF APPEALS**

The plaintiffs in this case hold title to a commercial office building on N. Oakland Avenue. They challenged the assessment placed upon the property by the Village Assessor and before the Shorewood Board of Review. They now challenge that same assessment in an appeal before the Milwaukee County Circuit Court. An answer to this complaint is due to be filed in January.

RE: Direct Legislation Petition

---

### **A. BACKGROUND**

An initiative is a direct voter action to enact a new law within a municipality. The right of initiative must be distinguished from another type of direct legislation, the right of referendum. In a referendum, voters may review an enactment by a municipality's governing body. Referenda are generally employed in attempts to defeat legislation which the municipality had the power to enact. The right of referenda are usually reserved to the people of a State in its constitution.

In Wisconsin, the right of initiative is not reserved to the people in the Constitution. Therefore, in Wisconsin an initiative is a creature of statute and its use must follow the requirements established by the legislature both for direct action legislation and for the specific area of legislation in which the initiative is attempted. Heitman v. City of Mauston, 226 Wis. 2d. 542, 546-547 (App. 1999).

Wisconsin Statutes create the right to a direct legislation initiative under Wisconsin Statute § 9.20. After a petition for direct legislation is properly circulated and certified by the Village Clerk under Wisconsin Statute § 9.20, the Village Board has the alternative of passing the ordinance within thirty days after the Clerk's certification or of submitting it to the electors at the next election. Wisconsin Statute § 9.20(4). In addition to these two alternatives, the Wisconsin Supreme Court has held that the Village Board may refuse to accept either of the statutory choices and may instead reject both of them if the language comes under one of the four exceptions that have been recognized by the Court. State ex rel Althouse v. Madison, 79 Wis. 2d 97, 107 (1977). The limitations to the use of Wisconsin Statutes § 9.20 are summarized in both the Althouse and the Heitman cases as follows:

1. the ordinance which is sought to be passed must be "legislative" in character because direct legislation may not extend to executive or administrative actions of a local legislative body;
2. direct legislation cannot be used to compel a village board to repeal an existing resolution of ordinance or to compel passage of an ordinance which would be in clear conflict with legislation already in existence;
3. citizens seeking to effect a § 9.20 initiative must exercise only those powers that have been conferred upon the village board;
4. where the Wisconsin Statutes establish procedures and standards for the accomplishment of legislation in a certain area, a § 9.20 initiative may not effect legislation which may modify the statutorily prescribed directives.

Althouse, 79 Wis. 2d at 108; Heitman, 26 Wis. 2d. at 458-459.

The challenge in reviewing a petition for direct legislation is to determine if its form and content are sufficient such that it may be enacted or submitted to the voters without any change in its language. Indeed, the Statute specifically directs that the Village Board adopt or refer the ordinance, "...without alteration". Wis. Stat. § 9.20 (1).

**B. THE PETITION FOR DIRECT LEGISLATION**

The petition for direct legislation which is presented either for approval or referral reads as follows:

The Village Board of the Village of Shorewood Wisconsin (the "Village") do ordain:

1. The Village shall not at any time after November 10, 1999 spend any money or incur any obligation in excess of \$1,000,000 in the aggregate for the period of November 10, 1999 through November 30, 2004 for design, construction, renovation, demolition, or expansion of the existing library or building or any ancillary improvements or any similar facility (whether in its current location or any similar location);
2. The Village shall not at any time after November 10, 1999 spend any money or incur any obligation for design or construction of a new public library or similar facilities;
3. This ordinance shall be deemed to supercede and control any conflicting ordinances or resolutions and any parts thereof.

After having studied this petition and having compared it to applicable Wisconsin Statutes and case law, it is my conclusion that there are substantial problems in the form and content of this proposed direct legislation which are fatally defective to its enactment. I have concluded that the proposed petition is not a proper subject of direct legislation and it is my recommendation that the board should neither pass the ordinance nor place it on the ballot. The reasons for this conclusion are further explained within the remainder of this memorandum.

**C. DIRECT LEGISLATION MAY NOT BE ADMINISTRATIVE**

In order to provide for the enactment of a valid ordinance which is legislative, its content must, "...show an intent to form a permanent rule of government...". Heider v. Wauwatosa, 37 Wis. 2d 466, 475 (1967). An ordinance with only a temporary effect is administrative and not the proper subject of direct legislation. In the Heider case, the Court considered and rejected proposed legislation which directed that the council could not make expenditures for additions to East High School for a period of three years. The Court found that the subject of that proposed direct legislation did not seek to create new law or a new plan but rather sought to control the administration of a current municipal policy. The Court found this to be administrative and not legislative and rejected it as an appropriate subject for direct legislation.

Similar to the rejected ordinance in Heider, the proposed direct legislation in this matter does not suggest positive action but by its very language appears to repeal or redirect a policy of the Village Board that is stated in Resolution 99-03 "A Resolution Regarding the Library Building Improvement Process" (enacted on February 1, 1999). The proposed legislation seeks to set out a plan different from that which has already been adopted by the Village Board. In that sense it appears to be administrative. Confirmation that its intent is administrative and not legislative can be found in language within the first section which limits the application to a five year period. Just like the three year period rejected as "temporary" in the Heider case, the five year limitation contained within the proposed ordinance is administrative. [See also: League of Wisconsin Municipalities Legal Opinion, Ordinances and Resolution #460 proposed direct legislation in the Village of Fox Point which would have prohibited the killing or removing of deer from the Village for a period of two years was found to be "temporary in nature" and thus administrative].



the rights of owners to buy, sell, lease, or rent property. As that Court stated:

It appears axiomatic that a legislature cannot by statute irrevocably withdraw a topic from the scope of future legislation; that is, a legislature cannot irrevocably bind its successors...city electors exercise only such legislative power or authority as is conferred upon the common council, it follows likewise that the Milwaukee electorate cannot irrevocably bind successor members of the common council.

Otey v. Common Council of Milwaukee, 281 F. Supp. 264, 275 (E. D. Wis. (1968)) [citing Feavel v. City of Appleton, 234 Wis. 483 (1940).] Because the language within the proposed ordinance seeks to bind future boards, it is not the proper subject of direct legislation.

#### **E. DIRECT LEGISLATION MAY NOT MODIFY STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS**

Where Wisconsin Statutes establish procedures and standards for the accomplishment of a certain objective, a § 9.20 initiative may not effect legislation that may modify those directives.

As one Court has stated:

This court has held that where a statute has conferred a procedure upon a body, electors may not demand the submission of a question which would modify the statutory authority.

Heider v. Wauwatosa, 37 Wis. 2d 466, 477 (1967). As an example, the Court in State ex rel Becker v. Common Council of Milwaukee 101 Wis. 2d 680 (App. 1981) examined an initiative which sought to remove the Milwaukee Chief of Police. The Court concluded that this initiative was not the proper subject of direct legislation since the Wisconsin Statutes gave the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners exclusive authority to remove the Police Chief. As another example, the Court found in Schaefer v. Potosi Village Board, 177 Wis. 2d 287 (App. 1993) that direct legislation which sought to prohibit the installation of sidewalks along certain portions of the Village highways was impermissible. The Court made note that the Wisconsin legislature had delegated to the Village Board the authority to build, alter, repair or to otherwise improve sidewalks in Wisconsin Statute § 61.36. Schaefer, 177 Wis. 2d at 291.

As applied to the present case, it would appear that the proposed direct legislation attempts to limit or otherwise undermine statutory authority extended to the Library Board or reserved for the Village Board under Wisconsin Statute § 43.58 and § 61.34. By Wisconsin Statutes, the Village Board holds the authority to direct the purchase of a site and the erection of a library building. By these same statutes, the Library Board holds exclusive charge, control, and custody of buildings, money and property acquired by the municipality for library purposes. By its terms, the proposed initiative seeks to limit the rights of the Village Board to carry out its authority in this regard. Of equal importance, the proposed direct legislation seeks to limit the rights of the Library Board to control its operations. Both the first and second sections limit the ability to “spend any money” irrespective of its source. This is specifically contrary to the statutory requirements.

There are a number of other sources of statutory authority for both the Village Board and the Library Board for which the proposed direct legislation is in conflict. Not the least of these is the provision in the first section which binds the Village for five years when even Wisconsin Statutes § 9.20 allows for repeal or amendment after two years. See Wis. Stat § 9.20 (8). Feavel v. City of Appleton, 234 Wis. 483 (1940). Direct legislation must be exercised within the time schedules that bind the legislative body and this proposed ordinance fails to do so.

#### **G. CONCLUSION**

I have never had the occasion to review a proposed direct legislation which failed on each of the four exceptions as described. A finding that the proposed ordinance was defective on any one of the four discussed in (C), (D), (E), or (F) may be sufficient for this board to find that it is

not the proper subject of direct legislation. On my review, a finding may be made on all four exceptions that this proposed direct legislation is not an appropriate subject for direct legislation.

On this review, it is my recommendation that a motion should be presented to refuse to either enact this ordinance or to refer the matter to the voters since the proposed ordinance is not a proper subject for direct legislation.

At your direction, I can provide further information, assistance, or analysis.

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Through your January 10, 2000 inquiry, you have directed some specific questions about the form and content of the proposed ordinance included within the direct legislation petition. My comments and recommendation about the proposed ordinance as an appropriate subject for direct legislation are contained within a separate memo. This is intended as a direct response to the 10 questions that you presented in your 1/10/00 memo.

1. Does the word "Village" in the second line include the Library Board?

The Village Board has enacted ordinances which have as their subject issues related to the library and the creation and operation of the Library Board. See Shorewood Ordinance Sec. 3-1203. I would interpret the word "Village" in the 2<sup>nd</sup> line to include the Library Board.

2. Does it include SCIF, Friends of the Library, the School Board?

It is difficult to know whether these other named entities were intended to be included within the ordinance. On initial overview, I would not expect that an ordinance enacted by the Village Board would control the activities of SCIF, Friends of the Library or the School Board.

3. Do the words “spend any money” cover just money raised by the tax levy, or does it also cover money raised from general or specific revenues or State tax payments?

4. Does “spend any money” also limit expenditures from grants and from charitable donations?

As to both questions 3 and 4, I would interpret the term “spend any money” to extend to any authorized expenditure that the Village Board would make regardless of the source of the funds. The Board makes expenditures from money raised through the tax levy, through monies received from the state and from other sources including grants and insurance proceeds. It would appear that the ordinance also seeks to limit the expenditures of money both for the operation of the library itself and for matters associated with the renovation or construction of the building. (“...of the existing public library or building...”). In that sense it would appear that the ordinance seeks to direct expenditures made by the Village Board and the Library Board.

5. Is the Village parking lot an “ancillary improvement”? The sidewalk surrounding the library?

This is a difficult question to answer. Words like “ancillary” or “improvements” often are used to relate to substantive changes and alterations in a piece of real estate other than the main house or building on that piece of land. In the present circumstance, the Village owns real estate on which there are a number of buildings and improvements, including the Village Hall, the Village Library and Center, the Health Department, the Police Department, etc. It is difficult to attribute any specific “ancillary improvement” to the Library/Village Center building as compared with other buildings on the property. In the context used within the ordinance, the term “ancillary improvement” is so vague that I have difficulty knowing what it would be intended to include.

6. Part (2) of the proposed ordinance precludes any expenditure for construction of a new public library. Could that be a new library at the same location, or would it be limited to a new location?

By its terms, enacting the 2<sup>nd</sup> section of this ordinance would bar the construction of a new public library regardless of its location.

7. If the answer to #6 is the former, how (at what point) do we differentiate between “renovation” and “new public library”?

The 2<sup>nd</sup> subsection of the ordinance does not distinguish between renovation or new construction. Since some could construe a renovated public library to be “new” it could be construed to include both.

8. Could we pursue a joint library with Whitefish Bay at a location other than the

current site in Shorewood?

Enacting the ordinance with the 2<sup>nd</sup> subsection would preclude attempts at the creation of a joint library with Whitefish Bay.

9. If the library burned down or otherwise suffered damage, would expenditures from insurance proceeds be subject to the limitations?

10. What about a sewer backup and any expenditures to resolve the situation?

Each of these questions has the same general premise. Enacting this ordinance, could effectively preclude the expenditure of money for repairs, renovations, alterations or new construction even if the source of these funds would be insurance proceeds or recovery to which the Village is entitled based upon issues of liability. Regardless of the source, the ordinance if enacted could prevent the expenditure of sums received from sources including insurance proceeds.

I hope this response when taken together with my explanation of the direct legislation ordinance is of assistance to you in your deliberations. If you should have any other questions, or should like follow up on any of these specific points, please let me know.

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I have had inquiries from trustees about the language of alternatives which may be used to the proposal for direct legislation. The idea shared with me was to identify language which may be consistent with the general purpose of that petition but without the language which I had found in an earlier memo to be inappropriate.

The Village Board has the flexibility to present an issue to the electors through an advisory referendum and not be bound by the legal requirements which may be in place for direct legislation. In this instance, the general context of a referendum question could incorporate a request on whether there should be an inquiry made to the voters before the Village Board commits itself to the construction costs in excess of one million dollars on the Library/Village Center project. Specifically, after having discussed this matter with Trustee Eschner, and after receiving his input I had proposed language which might meet that objective:



## **ADVISORY REFERENDUM**

The Village Board may proceed with the construction of a Library/Village Center project with a projected cost to the property taxpayers of greater than one million dollars only after first submitting the project to a referendum vote of the electors of Shorewood.

As another alternative, I did discuss with Trustee Erickson potential wording for a motion which the Board could consider and adopt without referendum. Since he indicated he will be circulating that proposal himself, I will not repeat that here.

If others have suggestions for additions or modifications to this proposal or any other alternative proposals, I would be happy to discuss them.

RE: Local Ordinances on the Sale and Use of Tobacco

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**I. RESTRICTIONS UPON ADVERTISING**

In spring of 1997 the Village Board explored two issues relating to the sale and marketing of tobacco products. One issue discussed was whether there could be local restrictions placed upon the sale of cigarettes in those environments where food and candy would also be targeted toward youth buyers. With regard to that question I offered the opinion that state law pre-empted Village of Shorewood from enacting such restrictions. I still believe that that pre-emption prevents local ordinances. (See my 2/21/97 memo - attached).

Another question presented was whether restrictions could be placed upon ads or signs for tobacco products. At that time, I offered the Board an opinion that federal law pre-empted Shorewood from enacting ordinances which would seek to control advertising for tobacco products. Although federal laws were in place which specifically prevented a local municipality from enacting such laws, I did indicate that I would continue to follow the matter and report since the law was in flux and in conflict. Although probably no more clear at this point, I did want to take the opportunity to report on what has occurred since that time.

Caselaw has continued to explore the authority of the federal government to control tobacco advertising and sales to the exclusion of local authority. As an example, in Federation of Advertising Industry Representatives Incorporated v. Chicago, (Appeal #98-3191 - 7<sup>th</sup> Cir. Decided 9/1/99) a Chicago ordinance banning publicly visible advertising of cigarette products and alcohol was found to be enforceable and not pre-empted by federal law. (Synopsis - attached). In contrast, and only two months later, the 9<sup>th</sup> Circuit found in Lindsey v. Tacoma-Pierce County Health Dept. that a county resolution which banned outdoor tobacco advertising within Pierce County Washington was unenforceable and pre-empted by federal law. (Case decision - attached).

It was hoped that clarity would come from the Supreme Court's decision in FDA v. Brown and Williamson Tobacco Corporation. That decision was released by the U.S. Supreme Court on March 21<sup>st</sup> finding that the federal government through the FDA did not have the right to regulate tobacco products. (Synopsis - attached). The scope of FDA v. Brown and Williamson, is only now beginning to be explored. Many had hoped that the court's decision would get the federal government out of the business of regulating tobacco products and allow state and local governments to again take control. However, new laws are currently pending in congress which would overturn the court's decision and reinstitute comprehensive control at the federal level. (News articles - attached).

The 7<sup>th</sup> Circuit's decision in Federation of Advertising in Industry Representatives when coupled with the U.S. Supreme Court's decision in F.D.A. v. Brown and Williamson changes the opinion that I gave in the spring of 1997; stronger arguments can be made that municipalities have the authority at a local level to enact ordinances which may control tobacco advertising. However, with the inconsistent changes in the law I would recommend that we continue to monitor the actions by the courts and the legislatures to determine what final authority may be available to the Village of Shorewood in this regard.

## **II. SMOKE-FREE FACILITIES**

At a recent meeting of the Village Board, reference was made to an article in the Journal of the American Medical Association which cited research finding that ordinances creating smoke-free restaurants had no negative impact upon business income. The question was raised as to what the study could mean in the Village of Shorewood. To that end, I have attached a copy of the JAMA article. I have also attached provisions from the Wisconsin Statutes and the Wisconsin Administrative Code which explains the limits that may be placed upon smoking within public places and the designation of “smoking” and “non-smoking” areas. More restrictive than the state statutes, some Wisconsin municipalities have adopted ordinances which have designated restaurants and bars to be “smoke-free” facilities. These include ordinances adopted in the City of Madison, the City of Eau Claire, and the City of Ashland. I have attached copies of these ordinances. Also provided is a “model” ordinance from the National Municipal Lawyers Organization. This gives an idea of what some communities have done.

Should any Board members have questions on any of the particular information attached, I would be happy to discuss them with you. Similarly, should any committee want to take any of these matters further please let me know.
